






The Persecuted Church 2015 World Watch List Trends

- The most rapidly growing area of persecution in the WWL is in the countries of Africa, especially in Sub-Saharan Africa.
- Worldwide levels of persecution have risen, but this has not been primarily due to increased violence, but increased cultural marginalization.
- Asia is facing more persecution again- several Asian countries have seen rising levels of persecution.
- Latin America is back on the radar- Mexico is on the World Watch List this year, along with Colombia.
- Islamic extremism is by far the most significant persecution engine- 40 of the 50 countries on the World Watch List are affected by this kind of persecution.
- Under the influence of ISIS, radical sentiments have increased in the Middle East. Many historically Christian communities have been forced to flee.



The rise in levels of persecution – especially for Christians. The end of the European colonial era, the end of Christianity's status as state religion in most of the West and the resurgence of religious sentiment globally, especially fundamentalism, all mean that Christians generally no longer operate from a position of power or privilege. Christians are subject to persecution in much of the world. Evangelicals are subject to even more due to their proselytism and commitment to the uniqueness of Christ. The presence of persecution and hardship in the life of the Church appears to be normative in Scripture; contexts where persecution does not exist at all should be as much cause for concern as places where it is intense.

a) The main offenders:

- *i* Muslim countries and regions the rise of extreme Islamist interpretations of the Muslim faith and the association of Christianity with "the Great Satan" have made Christians vulnerable to heightened religious violence coming from radicalized Muslims. The increasing application of shari'a law creates a climate where harsh persecution can easily occur. In a handful of countries, the courts may sentence a national to death for becoming a Christian; imprisonment awaits in several other nations. Beyond the government stance on such apostasy from Islam, community leaders and family members pressure new believers to revert to Islam and, occasionally, will murder those who will not.
- *ii Marxist/Communist states* continue to make life very difficult for Christians this is especially true in North Korea, where profession of faith leads to imprisonment and death, and in Laos, Vietnam, China and Cuba, where unregistered Christians have suffered severely.
- *iii Hindutva* philosophy in India and radicalization of some Hindus in Nepal have led to heightened pressure and acts of terror against Christians in parts of these countries.
- iv Buddhists have persecuted and maltreated Christians in Myanmar, Sri Lanka and Bhutan.
- *v Christian governments,* or government structures that endorse only one form of Christianity, have often been among the harshest persecutors of evangelicals. Examples of such instances include Eritrea, Belarus, southern Mexico and Russia.
- *vi Secular governments* most notably in Western Europe in their attempts to safeguard against dangerous sects and to further erase religion from public life have passed laws that make life difficult for believers to publicly practice their faith. Pluralism in such contexts apparently requires tolerance of every lifestyle and value system except for biblical Christianity.

All religious faiths are victims of persecution somewhere. In this supposedly enlightened, tolerant age, people routinely are brutalized, jailed, and killed for their faith—or lack of faith—in God. Hostility to believers is evident even in the West, long home to the strongest advocates for freedom of conscience, expression, and association. Worse, over the last year "a horrified world has watched the results of what some have aptly called violence masquerading as religious devotion" in several nations, observed the U.S. Commission on International Religious Freedom in its latest annual report.

However, the fact that everyone is persecuted does not mean that everyone persecutes equally, or at all. Authoritarian regimes which fear independent thought and allegiance to anyone or anything beyond the state tend to war against any public expression of faith. But such systems usually are equal opportunity oppressors. It is belief in a transcendent, not what that transcendent looks like, which they usually see as the problem.

In sectarian societies religious minorities often are persecuted for what they believe. They face varying challenges where Buddhists, Hindus, and Jews enjoy a majority, but these states are few (although Hindu India is the world's second most populous nation). A handful of at least nominally Christian countries persecute; however, this behavior most often reflects authoritarian politics (in former communist states) rather than theology. In a few cases, though, the Orthodox Church relies on the government for support against other Christian faiths.

In contrast, majority Muslim nations almost uniformly persecute. The only question is how virulent the repression. Believers are mistreated everywhere, but Christians most suffer in the birthplace of Christianity. The Iraq invasion and Arab Spring have loosed a campaign of religious cleansing across the Middle East.

The one glaring fact concerning the <u>persecution of</u> <u>approximately 100 million Christians</u> around the world today is that the overwhelming majority of it is being committed by Muslims of all races, nationalities, languages, and socio-political circumstances: Muslims from among America's allies (Saudi Arabia) and from its enemies (Iran); Muslims from economically rich nations (Qatar) and from poor nations (Somalia and Yemen); Muslims from "Islamic republic" nations (Afghanistan) and from "moderate" nations (Malaysia and Indonesia); Muslims from nations rescued by America (Kuwait) and Muslims from nations claiming "grievances" against the U.S. (fill in the blank __).

This fact is underscored in Open Doors' recent 2015 World Watch List—a report that highlights and ranks the 50 worst nations persecuting Christians. It finds that "Islamic extremism" is the main source of persecution in 40 of the top 50 countries—that is, 80 percent of the nations where Christians are

persecuted are Muslim. As for the top ten worst countries persecuting Christians, nine of them are Muslim-majority—that is, 90 percent of nations where Christians experience "extreme persecution" are Muslim.


